


We welcome our new Park Manager Mike Colombo. I and the HOA Directors look forward to continuing the great relationship with Park Management.

FMO April Update submitted by Jan Klafka

The FMO (Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida, Inc.) plays an important role in your life: WITHOUT FMO, there would be no Florida Statute 723 protecting your interests. WITHOUT FMO, you would be treated exactly like renters who rent apartments--with no choice other than to move if rents are raised. WITHOUT FMO, park owners could evict you to develop their land for some other use, and all of you would have to get out with NO assistance for moving your homes.

<u>W</u>ITH FMO, you enjoy statutory protections that have been won over the last more than 30 years. A membership in FMO brings you the FMO News six times a year and contains a wealth of information pertinent to manufactured home owners. Also, you have access to the FMO Website, <u>www.fmo.org</u>, where information is available about the FMO and various programs like the Cross Country Motor Club for road service (much like AAA but about 1/2 the cost). Your membership dues (\$22 a year) allow the FMO to continue its important work on your behalf.

Our last FMO District Meeting for this season will be held at Coral Cay on Wednesday, April 9. Coffee and donuts beginning at <u>9:30--meeting starts at 10:00</u>. All residents are invited. Contact me if you need a ride. Jan Klafka 954-270-5405
