
DEERFIELD LAKE T-SHIRT PROJECT

Bingo Report



Watch Dog March 2018

Avoid a PAINFUL increase in the assessment on your leased lot!

Vote YES...... Ballot Number 2

Your leased lot is assessed and taxed as commercial property. Assessments on commercial property have been restricted to 10% annually. Property taxes are passed on pro-rata if that is permitted in your prospectus. Amendment 2 must pass by 60% in November or the restriction ENDS!!!

This is the actual language placed on your ballot, November 2018:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE XII, SECTION 27

LIMITATIONS ON PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENTS— Proposing an amendment to The State Constitution to permanently retain provisions currently in effect, which limit property tax assessment increases on specified non-homestead real property, except for school district taxes, to 10 percent each year. If approved, the amendment removes the scheduled repeal of such provisions in 2019 and shall take effect January 1, 2019.

Hurricane Readiness

Things to have on hand

- Drinking water: One gallon per person per day for 3-5 days. Don't forget about water for your pets as well
- Food: Non-perishable foods that are packaged or canned; canned milk, cereal, energy bars, etc. You might also think about fruits that don't need refrigeration like apples and oranges. Don't forget your pets' food!
- Paper and plastic goods: Plates, bowls, plastic silverware, plastic or paper cups, paper towels, toiletries and toilet paper.
- Medication: You should make sure you have enough medication for up to two weeks on hand. Make sure any special medical equipment is charged if needed.
- A manual can opener.
- Flashlights and batteries
- Battery or hand fans
- Radio or TV that is battery operated
- Make sure phones are charged and you have back-up charging for cell phones, computers and tablets. If you have a land line, make sure one phone is not a cordless.
- Trash bags
- Extra charcoal or propane for your grills, USE OUTSIDE ONLY
- Mosquito repellent and sunscreen
- Fire extinguisher
