#### PET REMINDER

Animals are not permitted outside of the home unless they are on a retractable 6 foot leash that is held by an adult.

Pets are not permitted in any common area other than streets or sidewalks or the community even went on a handheld leach outdoor pet enclosures dog runs and or dog fences are not permitted in the community.

To ensure that a resident will be permitted to keep an animal in the home residents must be must obtain the landlord's approval prior to purchasing or acquiring the animal proof of registration and vaccinations must be provided to landlord within seven days of the animal's acquisition residents may not have more than one inside pet animal of small size weight of 40 pounds at maturity.

If you have a pet please stop by the community office so we may make a copy of your current pet registration or license and proof of rabies and or other appropriate vaccinations along with a photo of your pet so we can upgrade our records or provide you with information regarding the registration of pets.

## FROM THE NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS COMMITTEE

There will be an open seat on the Board in January 2025. Current Director, Dianna Saunders will be stepping down due to other commitments. We thank Dianna for her service to the community as she has worn many hats over the years. The Nominations Committee would especially like to thank her for her consideration to the Board by completing one full year of her second two-year term in order for a proper election to take place at the Annual Meeting on January 20, 2025.

Our By-laws say that we cannot have an even numbered board. Therefore we are looking for someone to complete Dianna's second year. In order to run for the board the only requirement is to be a bona fide homeowner. That means your name must appear on the title to your manufactured home. A copy of the title must be given to a Nominations Committee member for verification and then turned over to the Secretary of the Board.

Nominations may be made at the November and/or December HOA meetings. A person may nominate themselves or be nominated by another resident. To be nominated at an HOA meeting, the nominee must be in attendance at the meeting and must accept the nomination.

If there is only one candidate there will not be a formal election, the Secretary will just cast one vote. If there is more than one, then voting will be by ballot. The successful candidate will have 90 days to complete a training course via zoom. The HOA pays for the course, when the course is completed the certificate is to be given to the Secretary.

This election is for one year only. At the January Annual Meeting the current board members, including the newly elected candidate, will then reorganize, amongst themselves, electing a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. The newly elected candidate, if they so choose, will be eligible to run in 2026 for a full two year term. As they will be filling a spot on the Board for less than 13 months, according to our By-laws, they will be eligible for a second two year term as well.

If no one steps forward then a current Board member would have to step down as there can only be five or seven members. We sincerely hope that there are home owners in our community who are willing to serve. Please talk to current board members to find out more about serving on the board. If interested you can also contact any committee member, Nadia Mena, Bob Gross, or myself, Linda Caswell-Committee Chair.

It is so sad to see what the people affected by these storms go through and how they pull together. It is a lovely sight to see, so much better than the pettiness we see and hear about on a daily basis.



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#### **GRILLED CHICKEN KABOBS**

yield: 6 SERVINGS

prep: 1 HOUR 30 MINUTES

I cook: 20 MINUTES

I total: 1 HOUR 50 MINUTES

With the best marinated chicken, zucchini, bell pepper and red onion. Juicy, tender, and packed with so

much flavor!



- 6 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- ½ cup balsamic vinegar
- 3 tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

- 2 pounds boneless, skinless chicken thighs, cut
- 2 small to medium zucchini, sliced to 1/2-inch thick rounds
- 1 red bell pepper, cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces
- 1 yellow bell pepper, cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces
- 1 red onion, cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces

into 1-inch chunks

• 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- In a medium bowl, whisk together 4 tablespoons olive oil, balsamic vinegar, lemon juice, Dijon, I brown sugar, Worcestershire, garlic and Italian seasoning; season with salt and pepper, to taste. I Reserve 1/3 cup and set aside.
- In a gallon size Ziploc bag or large bowl, combine chicken and olive oil mixture; marinate for at least 1 hour to 4 hours, turning the bag occasionally. Drain the chicken from the marinade.
- Thread chicken, zucchini, bell peppers, and onion onto skewers. Brush with remaining 2 tablespoons olive oil; season with salt and pepper, to taste.
- Preheat grill to medium heat.
- Add skewers to grill, and cook, turning occasionally, until the chicken is completely cooked through, reaching an internal temperature of 165 degrees F, about 10 minutes. Brush skewers with reserved olive oil mixture, cooking for an additional 1-2 minutes.
- Serve immediately, garnished with parsley, if desired.
